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MISSION STATEMENT

The American School in Switzerland (TASIS) welcomes young people from all nationalities to an educational community that fosters a passion for excellence along with mutual respect and understanding. Consistent with the vision of its founder, M. Crist Fleming, TASIS is committed to transmitting the heritage of Western civilization and world cultures: the creations, achievements, traditions, and ideals from the past that offer purpose in the present and hope for the future. Seeking to balance the pursuit of knowledge with the love of wisdom, and promoting the skills of lifelong learning, an appreciation for beauty, and the development of character, each school combines a challenging academic program with opportunities for artistic endeavor, physical activity, and service to others. Believing in the worth of each individual and the importance of enduring relationships, TASIS seeks to embody and instill the values of personal responsibility, civility, compassion, justice, and truth.

TASIS is a family of international schools with additional campuses in England, Puerto Rico, and Portugal.

THE SCHOOL

TASIS Switzerland is the first of several TASIS Schools founded by M. Crist Fleming. Founded in 1956 as a private, co-educational boarding and day school, it is the

oldest American boarding school in Europe. Now serving students from Pre-Kindergarten to Postgraduate, TASIS is accredited by the New England Association of Schools & Colleges and the European Council of International Schools. English is the primary language of instruction in the High School.

FACULTY

Of the 68 High School faculty members, 82 percent hold advanced degrees and 52 percent hail from the United States. TASIS actively encourages professional development, supports faculty graduate study, and requires teachers to participate in a professional growth and evaluation program.

STUDENT BODY

The High School is composed of 246 boarding students and 173 day students, with 49* nations represented. The majority of students (59%) come from Europe, with the remainder hailing from Latin America (14%), the United States and Canada (12%), Asia (9%), and the Middle East and Africa (9%). The Class of 2024 comprises 121 students, and the High School retention rate is 83%.

CURRICULUM

TASIS offers an American college preparatory program with International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement programs, emphasizing a strong liberal arts education and requiring components of community service and project-based academic travel experiences at all grade levels. Students are expected to complete a minimum of 19 credits and to enroll in a minimum of five full-credit courses each semester. (An alternative program of studies may be designed for students with special talents, interests, or needs. Such a program must follow established guidelines and requires the approval of the Academic Committee.)

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The minimum requirements for graduation are 19 credits, including the following:

- Four years of English. All grade 12 students must pass either a grade 12 English course offered by the English Department or IB English B HL (Year 2, and IB Diploma candidates only). Non-IB EAL students must pass English, Grammar, Composition, and British Literature.
- Third-year proficiency (equivalent to completion of a level 3 language at TASIS or B1 proficiency as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference) in a modern language other than English that is offered at TASIS
- Three credits of History, including Modern History and either US History or an IB Group 3 course (IB Diploma candidates only), and successful completion of the Civic Literacy Exam (typically during grade 11 or 12)
- Three credits of Laboratory Science
- Three credits of Mathematics, completing Mathematics 3 Core at a minimum
- One credit in Performing Arts or Visual Arts
- All students in grades 9 and 10 are required to take and earn credit in Health and Physical Education.
- Senior Humanities is fulfilled by AP US History, Art History, AP Art History, IB Art History, or, for IB Diploma candidates, Theory of Knowledge.
- Earn a passing grade in the Opsahl Global Service Program each semester enrolled through grade 11 and participate in at least one service trip or local service experience. New grade 12 and PG students must also earn passing grades both semesters and participate in a global service trip or local service experience.
- Fulfillment of the Sports and Activities requirement each semester
- Completion of all Academic Travel assignments and obligations

TASIS POLICY ON REPORTING GPA AND CLASS RANK

The school year is divided into two semesters, ending in December and June. The year-end grade is cumulative, covering the full work in a year's course and reflecting a 50%/50% weighting for the first and second semesters, respectively. The Academic Honor Roll is calculated each midterm and end-of-semester grading period. Students with a GPA of 3.8 or higher in a given semester receive Highest Honors while those with a 3.5 or higher receive High Honors and those with a 3.2 or higher receive Honors. TASIS does not rank students or report cumulative GPAs to universities because the majority of TASIS seniors have been at TASIS for fewer than four semesters at the time of university application.

STATEMENT ABOUT TASIS TRANSCRIPTS

Beginning with the 2021–2022 academic year, TASIS has changed the grading scale for all IB Diploma course students from an A–F scale to a 1–7 scale. Students in AP or non-IB Diploma courses will continue to be assessed with an A–F scale. The equivalency scale we would recommend using is as follows:

6/7 = A | 5 = B | 4 = C | 3 = D

In 2023, 73 TASIS students took a total of 361 IB subject exams (scored 1-7): 93% of scores were 4 and above, 80% were 5 and above, and 55% were 6 and above.

AP EXAMS

In 2023, 149 TASIS students combined to take a total of 339 AP exams: 83% of scores were 3 or above, 49% were 4 or above, and 124 students recorded a 3 or higher on at least one exam, which The College Board defines as a school success rate of 83%. A record 48 students were named AP Scholars for demonstrating exemplary college-level achievement on their exams.

Opsahl Global Service Program

The Opsahl Global Service Program was envisioned by Jan Opsahl '68, the School's first international student, who believes that the experience of serving those in need should be required for every TASIS student. Global Service groups partner with an array of organizations, from international nonprofits to country-specific institutions to local charities, and students attend weekly service meetings throughout the year to prepare for service trips throughout Europe, Africa, and Asia.

Academic and Independent Travel

Travel is an integral part of a TASIS education. Whether academic or independent travel, students have an exceptional opportunity to take advantage of their

location in the middle of Europe. Academic Travel is part of the Middle and High School curriculum and is a graduation requirement for all students. Some travel assignments are related to courses of study, some are related to particular student interests, and others are assigned by grade level.
